Georgia's Pre-K Child Assessment Program - Background



- Need for improved and consistent child assessment identified – 2003-2004
- Collaborative committee reviews multiple child assessment systems – 2003-2004
 - Aligned with state standards
 - Embedded in a natural setting
 - Provided useful information for improving classroom instruction
 - Incorporated existing practices
- Work Sampling System selected 2003-2004

Georgia's Pre-K Child Assessment Program - Pilot



- Georgia's Pre-K Assessment Pilot 2004-2005
 - 500 classrooms
 - Teacher training
 - Ongoing classroom support Regional Assessment Coordinators (RACs)
- Georgia's Pre-K Assessment Pilot 2005-2006
 - Increase in participating classrooms
 - Improved and expanded teacher training
 - Ongoing support for classrooms and administrators RACs

Georgia's Pre-K Child Assessment Program - Pilot



- Georgia's Pre-K Assessment 2006-2007
 - Statewide roll-out
 - All Pre-K teachers and assistants trained (7,600)
 - All Pre-K Project and Site Directors trained
 - Increased role for RAC's
 - On-site consultation with teachers
 - Follow-up small group training session spring 2007
- Georgia's Pre-K Assessment 2007-2008
 - Improved teacher training
 - Online learning modules developed by Georgia State Univ.
 - RAC's work with new teachers and struggling sites

Georgia's Pre-K Child Assessment Program - Training



- Teacher Training
 - Online Learning Module
 - Explains basic components of Georgia's Pre-K Assessment
 - Describes the organizational set-up for collecting child data
 - Defines assessment specific terminology
 - Prepares teacher for one-day classroom training session
 - One-day classroom training session
 - Focuses on the links between assessment, planning, and instruction
 - Advanced training 2007-2008
 - Planning meaningful instruction
 - Increased classroom application of assessment data

Georgia's Pre-K Child Assessment Program - Training



- Teacher Training Three-Year Plan
 - Year One : Basic Fundamentals
 - Understanding of assessment timelines
 - Preliminary ratings (every four weeks)
 - Conferences with families (twice each school year)
 - Familiarization with assessment materials
 - Omnibus
 - Developmental Guidelines
 - Developmental Checklist
 - Georgia Pre-K Progress Report
 - Organization of assessment system
 - Student files
 - Teacher file

Georgia's Pre-K Child Assessment Program - Training



- Teacher Training Three-Year Plan
 - Year Two : Incorporation
 - Strengthen link between assessment and classroom planning
 - Direct link between preliminary ratings and classroom activities
 - Lesson plans
 - Individualized activities
 - Higher-level training offered to support integrating assessment and instruction

Georgia's Pre-K Child Assessment Program - Training



- Teacher Training Three-Year Plan
 - Year Three : Seamless Practice
 - Assessment seen as a classroom tool
 - Teachers and assistants use assessment to guide classroom instruction
 - Classrooms are responsive to individual student needs
 - Individualized student activities based on need
 - Flexible grouping based on assessment data

Georgia's Pre-K Child Assessment Program - Family Connection



Georgia Pre-K Progress Report

- Two required conferences with families each school year
- Summarizes individual child growth and development
- Provides parents with strategies on how they can support their child's growth

Georgia's Pre-K Child Assessment Program - Monitoring



Georgia's Pre-K Program Quality Assessment (PQA)

Administered by Pre-K Consultants:

- Classroom environments
- Instructional practices/planning
- Implementation of child assessment
 - Used to target technical assistance on child assessment if needed

Georgia's Pre-K Child Assessment Program - Monitoring



Support for Teachers

- Online PQA learning module
- Online Assessment learning module
- On-site technical assistance
 - Pre-K Consultants
 - Regional Assessment Coordinators
 - Mentor Teachers
- Focused small group support sessions conducted regionally

Georgia's Pre-K Child Assessment – Kindergarten Transition



2006-07

- Statewide Kindergarten assessment was developed
 - DECAL and DOE collaboration to develop Kindergarten assessment plan
 - Similar to Work Sampling System
 - Report out by domains
 - Portfolio collection.
 - Observations in natural settings

2007-08

 Statewide Kindergarten assessment (GKIDS) in pilot 2008-09

Pre-K and Kindergarten teachers will be trained on both assessments.

Georgia's Pre-K Child Assessment – Training, Training, and More Training
