Erikson students learn how critical factors like brain development, the effects of trauma, and relationship-based learning factor into problems faced by youth, families, and communities.

This degree program requires two years of field experience — completing at least a total of 900 hours supervised field work. With over 100 field placements in Chicago area, Erikson Institute can help you earn relevant experience.

Applicants who received a BSW within six years of application may waive up to 20 credit hours of the program.
