Early Childhood Bilingual/English Second Language (ESL) Certificate Program

Prepare to work with linguistically diverse students in a program focused solely on supporting the language and academic development of children from birth to second grade. For teachers who wish to continue to work or seek employment in an early childhood Bilingual or ESL program, the program meets the Illinois State Board of Education requirements for a bilingual and/or ESL endorsement. This graduate certificate can also enhance the preparation of early childhood professionals working with emergent bilinguals or multilinguals and their families in other settings.

The certificate program culminates in a two-semester reflective practice seminar. In this seminar and in collaboration with peers and a faculty mentor, you will examine issues pertaining to your particular professional practice with linguistically diverse children and their families.

Career Opportunities

Early Childhood Bilingual/ESL Graduate Certificate graduates come from and continue to practice in a variety of settings and roles such as: preschools, early child care programs, public schools, private and charter schools, and social service agencies. Graduates can also consider careers as: child development specialist, early childhood program director, and curriculum coordinator.

- As an admitted certificate student, you may be eligible for federal student aid.
