Immigration & Financial Information

Confidential Statement of Financial Support

International students who are admitted to Erikson's master's degree programs may apply for F-1 status to be eligible to enter the US as a non-immigrant student.

If you wish to apply for F-1 status, United States immigration regulations require that you submit evidence of adequate funding to meet the estimated cost of attendance for your first year of study before a Certificate of Eligibility (Form I-20) can be issued by Erikson Institute. You will be asked to complete and submit the enclosed Confidential Statement of Financial Support, along with a current (dated) original bank statement which bears the bank's seal verifying the availability of funds for the required amount within your Admissions Application portal. Please take note of the following as you begin the process of submitting your financial support documentation:

- 1. Bank statements or other documents indicating availability of fund should be no older than 90 days from the date you submit your Confidential Statement of Financial Support.
- 2. Documents must be issued in English or be accompanied by an official, notarized translation.
- 3. Declarations of assets/property, tax filing, or statements of estimated earnings from employers cannot be accepted. Nor can bonds, stocks, credit card limits. Any funds not immediately accessible are not acceptable.
- 4. Erikson is not responsible if the funds shown to be available by the student or sponsor(s) on the Confidential Statement of Financial Support become unavailable after the date on the document.
- 5. If you are receiving financial support from more than one sponsor, please complete and submit a separate Confidential Statement of Financial Support for each sponsor.

Passport information

In order to make sure that all of your immigration documents have your official, legal name on them, please submit a copy of the identification (photo) page of your passport along with the Confidential Statement of Financial Support within your Admissions Application portal.

Transferring your Form I-20 from another institution

If you are currently attending another institution in F-1 status and have been admitted to Erikson's masters or certificate programs, you must apply for a new "transfer" I-20 from Erikson. Please submit the Confidential Statement of Financial Support, a Transfer Release Form (available at www.erikson.edu/international), supporting financial documents and a copy of your passport's identification page as outlined above within your Admissions Application portal.

Students in other non-immigrant categories

If you entered the United States on a visa type other than F-1, please submit a photocopy of the identification (photo) page, the US visa stamp, and both sides of the I-94 card from your passport as verification of your current status.

Note: The documents outlined above are not admission requirements for Erikson's masters or certificate programs. They are required documents for the issuance of your Certificate of Eligibility/Form I-20.

You will complete the Confidential Statement of Financial Support and upload all financial documents directly to your Admissions Application Portal.

Financial Aid Resources

We realize that the decision to attend Erikson involves a very serious consideration of the financial implications of such a decision. While international students are generally expected to fully finance their degree program, there may be ways to finance your degree program:

- Scholarships: Erikson offers a limited number of Leadership Scholarship opportunities for international students enrolled in one of the master's degree programs. Find out more here: www.erikson.edu/admissions/financial-aid-tuition/scholarship/
- Loans: A selected number of banks offer loans for international students to finance their education. In order to be eligible, international students must have a co-signer who is a US citizen or permanent resident. Timing Considerations

Student visas are prioritized over tourist visas however, appointment wait times and processing times will vary by country depending on local U.S. embassy/consulate procedures. It is important to follow the guidance of the specific location where you will be applying for your student visa. Some individuals may qualify for an interview waiver, while others may need to schedule the first available appointment and work to obtain an expedited appointment closer to the start of the program date.

Generally, you will need to allow Erikson Institute 2 weeks to issue Form 1-20 after submitting all required documentation. The average for U.S. Visa appointment with wait and processing (U.S. consulate or embassy) is 1-3 months.
